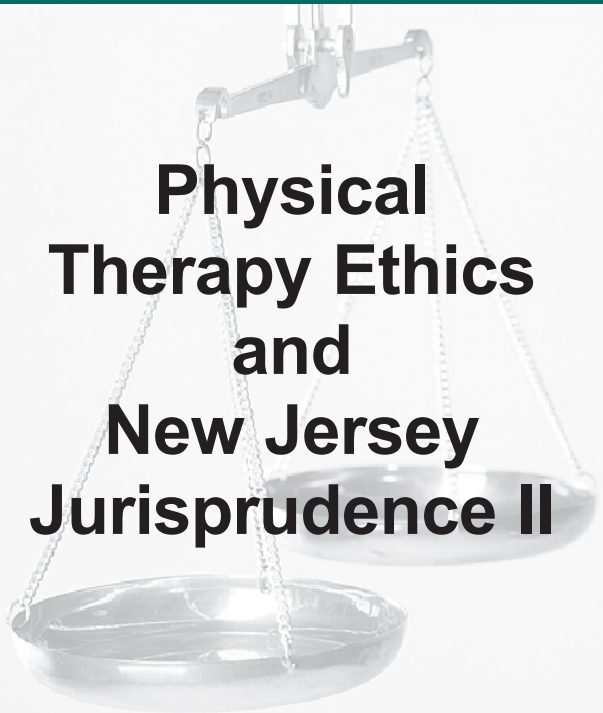

About the Program

This half-day program satisfies the New Jersey State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners mandatory requirement of four continuing education credits in ethics and jurisprudence for the 2010-2012 licensure renewal period. This interactive problem solving course utilizes actual situations from across the country to engage participants in introspective professional decision making. It builds upon the basic course provided by Dr. Kirsch during the 2008-2010 licensure period. The course is designed to be an interactive case based demonstration of the interaction and independence of ethics and law in the practice of physical therapy.

About the Speaker

Nancy R. Kirsch, PT, DPT, PhD is a professor of physical therapy and Director of the Doctor of Physical Therapy Program at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (UMDNJ) in Newark, New Jersey. In addition, Dr. Kirsch provides school based physical therapy services in Morris County. She currently serves on the Board of Physical Therapy Examiners, Division of Consumer Affairs. She is on the Board of Directors of the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy, and a member of the national American Physical Therapy Association's (APTA) Reference Committee. Dr. Kirsch has won numerous awards including The APTA Lucy Blair Service Award and she was the Recipient of the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy Presidents Award. She was inducted into the UMDNJ Master Educator Guild and currently serves on the Executive Board. Dr. Kirsch presents on topics in ethics and risk management on the national level at APTA and other professional meetings. Dr. Kirsch writes a monthly column in *PT in Motion Magazine*, called Ethics in Practice.
